## ATCEUC comment to ICB's "Just Culture: Problem statement"

Brussels, 13 October 2020

Since 2010 ATCEUC, together with the other ATM Social Partners, has been working on a common effort to promote Just Culture in Air Traffic Management, in Aviation and in all the "High Consequence Industries".

ATCEUC agrees that while the Just Culture seems have permeated the whole of the European Aviation domain, there remain problems in how the different National Judiciary Systems interpreted behave in the Just Culture environment.

ATCEUC disagrees with EU Regulation 376 when it states that it is not necessary to interfere with National Sovereignty with regards to Judicial autonomy.

Overcoming different and sometime conflicting National Laws is the primary reason EU Regulations are issued in the interest of the entire EU population.

The aim of Just Culture is the same, to raise the level of Safety in Aviation across the European continent, in the interest of the entire population, both those flying and those who are overflown, regardless of the country they live in, with Just Culture there is a strong mandate for the EU to do just that.

For this reason ATCEUC is asking the European Commission and the European Parliament to jointly issue a Regulation with binding specific
